Dear CCA Family:

I warmly welcome you to another exciting school year at CCA! Already as we held the Dedication Service and Orientation of new students and returning seventh and eighth grade students, we could feel the excitement of the community. We miss some students and faculty who were unable to return this year, but will pray for them that they will continue to honor God in their lives.

A very special welcome to all new faculty/staff, parents and students. We are delighted that you have chosen CCA, joining so many who have continued on at CCA this fall.

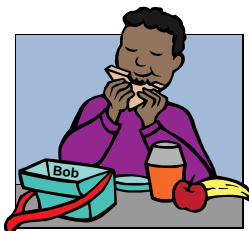
