

To love the Church like Jesus, we sacrificially share our lives, our resources, and our gifts.

At Christian Central Academy we endeavor to be the hands and feet of Jesus, in our service to others. We understand that giving of our time and our gifts requires a greater commitment than simply sharing or donating our resources.

In Matthew 25:40 Jesus says 'Truly I tell you, whatever you did for one of the least of these brothers and sisters of mine, you did for me.'

"Our goal is to actualize the teaching in 1 John 3:18 'Dear children, let us not merely say that we love each other; let us show the truth by our actions'."

With this in mind, we created service opportunities for students and staff alike. There was a great stirring of hearts throughout our CCA community as we partnered with several agencies and organizations to help and assist those in need. We collected and sent supplies to Houston and Puerto Rico through the National Guard, following their hurricane season. Twenty CCA families delivered Thanksgiving meals throughout the city of Buffalo through the Buffalo City Mission's Turkey Express! Program. We partnered with the Kevin Guest House to prepare meals throughout

the year for families receiving critical care at area hospitals. A handful of students ice-skated with disabled children for 6 months in preparation for a Celebration on Ice show with SABAH, Inc. Our students have made blankets for children entering the foster care system, scarves for the homeless, cookies and cupcakes for a women's shelter, cleaning and organizing at a donation center, and spent time visiting the elderly in the city of Buffalo.

Hands-on participation fosters a love for God's people. We make

connections with people, see our common humanity, and share the love of Christ with those who know Him - and more importantly, with those who don't. As our program grows, we will engage more students and create more opportunities to shed this love abroad, as we've been commanded to do.

We are so grateful for the teachers and students who have impacted our children for the last four years. Are they perfect people? No. I think all of them pictured here would laugh if I said that they were perfect. These intelligent, creative, self-sacrificing, unique, fun-loving, adventurous, wonderful people are the community of Christian Central Academy. God brought us here together that we, with our children, might grow "in wisdom and stature, and in favor with God and man" (Luke 2:52). Perfection was never our intention when we chose Christian Central Academy for our children's education.

Christian community was the hope and the reason that we made drastic changes in our two children's educational trajectory. We longed for God's direction, and with one verse, that led our way from cradle until 2015, we followed Him to this people, this place.

"From the time our children were born, my husband prayed Luke 2:52 by their bedside. He prayed that God would lead them like his own Son, that our two children would grow "in wisdom and stature, and in favor with God and man" and that we, as their parents, would do nothing to hinder His teaching, but that we would serve Him and honor Him in that journey."

The day I came to visit Christian Central Academy, the very first thing that I saw above the building entrance was that verse. Luke 2:52 was God's word and confirmation to welcome our family into the community of Christian

educators and families seeking God's direction and blessing in this world, just like us. We have been at CCA for almost four years now. Our son is a sophomore. Our daughter is a senior, and she will graduate this June. She loves her school and is thrilled to have had the opportunity to learn with good friends, caring teachers, an incredible volleyball coach, and an inspiring art teacher. Throughout her high school experience she has been motivated and encouraged to embrace leadership opportunities. She has been challenged to employ her gifts, talents, and creative ideas. She has been led to consider how she could positively impact her school and community.

Throughout these four brief high school years she has learned, in small and tangible ways, what it feels like to set goals, to research, to be on a team, on a committee, to agree, to disagree, to respect others, to plan, to face disappointment, to apply prayer, to study, to fail, succeed, to write, revise, persist, and continue to work for her own good and for the good of others. If you asked her, she would tell you that this school has made the greatest impact on her heart and life for Christ. She came to Christian Central Academy in 2015 so broken, but because of great love and strong intention that only God could administer through His people, she is leaving mended, molded, and confident to move forward as God leads her into art education. Teachers and friends, the people in our school community, are so critical to who they are becoming apart from us.

Our children will do, one day, exactly what we have done. They will choose a place to live and a people with whom they will experience life. Our prayer is that they will hold to the same gracious and merciful Guide that has blessed our lives as a family. God is so faithful. His Word, His illuminating, unfailing Word, is "a lamp to our feet and a light to our path" (Psalm 119:105). May this lesson lead their journey. To God be the glory in His people.


Expanded Career Development Pathways

CCA is pleased to announce that it will be opening its doors to BOCES/Harkness CTE programs for the 2019-20 school year to provide CCA High School students with expanded career development pathways.

These pathways constitute additional options for electives that were not previously available to its students: such as animal science, aviation technology, criminal justice, cybersecurity and networking, digital media, early childhood education, electronics and computer technology, and health fields to name a few.

These programs complement CCA's traditional college-preparatory focus while simultaneously providing career preparation pathways in high-demand fields. The numerous partnerships that are in place enable college credits to be earned through some of the programs which complement CCA's expanding Dual-Enrollment and AP courses. Thus, CCA students have an expanded compilation of options for getting a head start on either their college and university experience or their post-graduate technical training.

As a result, CCA can better tailor the educational experiences and development of its community to the individual interests, calling, and passions of each student to fulfill its mission to provide an environment where its students will grow "in wisdom and stature, and in favor with God and man."


NOVEMBER


